

STA – Olomouc – Ostrava

What are you waiting for?

Day 1

08:30 – start at Clarion Congress (Freyova street)

During first day you will be participate on excursion of Želivka dam.

The lunch will be served at the local restaurant Rebel na Farských in the town Žďár nad Sázavou, which is best known for UNESCO's sight Pilgrimage Church of St. John Nepomuk at Zelená hora.

You will join the excursion of Church.

Pilgrimage Church of St. John Nepomuk at Zelená hora

In 1719, when the Roman Catholic Church declared the tongue of John of Nepomuk to be incorruptible, work started to build a church at Zelená hora, where the future saint had received his early education. It was consecrated immediately after John's beatification in 1720, although construction works lumbered on until 1727. Half a century later, after a serious fire, the shape of the roof was altered.

The church, with many furnishings designed by Santini himself, is remarkable for its gothicizing features and complex symbolism, quite unusual for the time. In 1994, it was declared a World Heritage Site.

Olomouc

Olomouc is a city in Moravia, in the east of the Czech Republic. Located on the Morava River, the city is the ecclesiastical metropolis and historical capital city of Moravia. Today it is an administrative centre of the Olomouc Region and sixth largest city in the Czech Republic. The city has about 100,154 residents, and its larger urban zone has a population of about 480,000 people.



Day 2

After breakfast you will join walking tour through Olomouc downtown. The lunch will be served in the restaurant in the town Šumperk during the bus trip to the Dlouhé Stráně, where you will participate on guided excursion.

Then our bus will take you to the city of Ostrava, the capital of the Moravian – silesian region, located nearby the border with Poland. You will stay the nights in the hotel Park Inn. <https://www.parkinn.cz/hotel-ostrava>

Ostrava

Ostrava is a city in the north-east of the Czech Republic and is the capital of the Moravian-Silesian Region. It is 15 km from the border with Poland, at the meeting point of four rivers: the Odra, Opava, Ostravice and Lučina. In terms of both population and area Ostrava is the third largest city in the Czech Republic



Day 3

Your day will start with breakfast in Park Inn, after that you will visit Landek Park, where you will participate on excursion.

Landek Park

It is a globally famous location from the point of view of geology, archaeology, history, natural science and mining studies. The combination of a mining museum as a technological monument and the Landek hill as a national natural monument with its rich flora and fauna adds uniqueness and attraction to the area. On the south-eastern slope of the Landek hill, with its natural science and mining educative trail, there is a unique geological cross section with layers of the carbon type coal which originated 250 million years ago and which surface through numerous coal seam exits. In 1993 Landek was declared National Natural Monument. In the immediate vicinity of Landek there is the confluence of the Odra and Ostravice rivers.



Your lunch will be served directly in the Landek Park in the restaurant Harenda u Borborky.

After the lunch you will participate on the excursions of Šance dam and Morávka dam. Following by bus trip which will transfer you back to the hotel Park Inn, where you will enjoy dinner in the hotel's restaurant Bamboo.

Day 4

Final day of your trip will start with breakfast and check out.

Then our bus will take you to the Rožnov pod Radhoštěm, where you will participate on the excursion of Wallachian Open Air Museum in Rožnov pod Radhoštěm.

Rožnov pod Radhoštěm

Rožnov is a sort of miniature Wallachia, at least as far as it concerns the history of its settlement. It was founded in the period of the first farming colonization in the 13th century. From the 16th century clearings began to be made on the foothills and in the mountains around the town which then formed two separate settlements, Dolní and Horní Paseky, in the valleys near two mountain streams. And finally shepherds' huts began to appear above Rožnov on Mt. Radhošť, Mt. Černá and Bača's hill.



The lunch will be served in the local restaurant Brasserie Avion. After that our bus will take you back to the hotel Clarion Congress in Prague. Expected arrival time is at 4:30 pm.
